A Christmas Craft

On Christmas Day we celebrate the glorious birth of Jesus. Today's craft will give the students an opportunity to focus on the true meaning of Christmas and put into practice how it is better to give than receive.

SUPPLIES NEEDED

- Paper bags
- Ribbon
- Tissue paper
- Crayons, colored pencils, or colored markers
- Scissors
- Birthday Gift Template (pg. 2 to follow)
- Birth of Jesus Template (pg. 3 to follow)
- Optional: Small treat (chocolate kiss or other candy)


PREPARATION BEFORE ACTIVITY

- Print the "Birthday Gift" Template (each student needs 1)
- Print the "Birth of Jesus" Template and cut in $\frac{1}{2}$ (each student needs a $\frac{1}{2}$ sheet copy)

WHAT TO DO

- 1. Give each child a bag and a copy of the Birthday Gift Template.
- 2. Instruct students to color the Birthday Gift Template pictures. Cut out each picture.
- 3. On one side of the bag, glue the NATIVITY pictures.
- 4. On the other side of the bag, glue the BIRTHDAY CAKE picture.
- 5. Place *inside* the bag:
 - The red heart
 - The ½ sheet of the story of the "Birth od Jesus"
 - A "treat" (optional)
- 6. Place the tissue inside and tie the bag up with a ribbon.
- 7. Instruct students to take their gift home and place under their Christmas tree. They may open and read aloud the story of the "Birth of Jesus" with their families on Christmas morning to be reminded of the true meaning of the day.
