Scripture: Luke 1:30-33 (RSV)

After all, a special star played a very important part in the story of the birth of Christ. Some people like to put an angel at the top of their tree. That's a good choice too, because angels also played a very important role in the same story.

As you probably know, angels are messengers from God. Today, I want to tell you about a very important angel by the name of Gabriel. Many years ago, the Angel Gabriel was sent by God to deliver a message to a young woman named Mary, who was engaged to be married to a man named Joseph.
