Our students have heard that according to tradition, Sts. Thaddeus and Bartholomew were the first enlighteners of Armenia, that they spread the good news there and later were martyred. The following is an activity connected with one of the few Scripture references to either of these apostles.

Materials Needed:

Bartholomew's name suggests that he may have been a special kind of student. "Bar" means son, so Bartholomew was probably "son of Talmi." This was a noble name at the time of Jesus. A talmi was highly regarded in Hebrew circles as a leader of the study of scripture, and Bartholomew may have been one of the special students of that school.
