It is only the <u>church</u> that unites the couple by the hands of an <u>ordained priest</u> and on behalf of the <u>Lord Jesus Christ</u>. When a man and a woman marry within the Church, it is God who unites their bodies and souls. Marriage is a life commitment and the Sacrament emphasizes the inseparable unity between the husband and wife. Jesus said, "*Therefore what God has joined together let no man separate*." The Church offers lengthy prayers to safeguard the lasting unity between the husband and his wife. Separation and divorce are the denials of God's intentions for marriage, and instead of ending the marriage, a couple should concentrate on patience, understanding, and responsibility to prevent such danger.

SACRAMENT OF CROWNING

SAY: Holy Matrimony in the Armenian Church is known as the **Sacrament of CROWNING.** During the wedding ceremony, the bride and groom join their foreheads together and the Armenian Church crowns the couple as king and queen by actually placing **crowns** or a **tricolor** (*white, green, red*) braid with a little cross in front onto their heads. Unlike other churches, the central prayer of the Armenian Church's Holy Matrimony service specifies <u>royalty</u> and symbolizes the establishment of a new kingdom within the Kingdom of God as the crowns are put on the bride and groom. (*At this time, a special hymn is sung dedicated to the first king and queen of Armenia, Trdat and Ashkhen.*)

SAY: The Best Man has a very important duty during this portion of the service. He holds a cross in his right hand over the couple's heads to bless them as they take their marriage vows. In Armenian weddings, the best man is known as the 'kavor' or 'knkahayr,' which translate to "godfather" in English. The wedding godfather differs from a christening (baptismal) godfather, but his role is essentially the same, to support and watch over the marriage.

Then, as the crowns are removed, another special prayer that reflects <u>humility</u> in terms of service and dedication, as well as <u>dignity</u> and <u>power</u> under the banner of the Church or Cross. The model of marriage that men and women have to follow is that of the Holy Family: Jesus, the Virgin Mary and Saint Joseph.

SAY: There is a story told in the Bible in the **Book of John 2:1-11** about a very important wedding that Jesus and His mother attended.

ASK: Does anyone know the name of that wedding? (ANS: Wedding at Cana in Galilee)

SAY*:* Jesus attended this wedding with His blessed mother Mary and the 12 disciples. Something miraculous happened at the Wedding at Cana.

ASK: Can anyone tell me what happened? *If no one knows the answer, continue with below to give them a hint*! (*ANS: Jesus turned water into wine*) (As you continue your discussion, use your 2 glasses and pour the warm water into the empty glass with red food coloring.)

SAY: Yes! The guests at the party had run out of wine, so Jesus performed His very 1st miracle and changed water into wine. At the conclusion of the wedding ceremony in the Armenian Church, a cup of wine is blessed and presented to the bride and the

	groom to taste. This is a direct reference to the miracle Jesus performed at Cana. His presence at this wedding is recognized during every wedding ceremony in the Armenian Church. (Optional to read: John 2:1-11 together as a group.)
	WEDDING GIFTS SAY: Traditionally, guests bring gifts to present to the newly married couple. While these gifts are generous and appreciated, the most important gifts given to the happy couple on their wedding day are bestowed by the Holy Spirit.
	ASK : Can anyone guess what gifts the Holy Spirit might be giving the bride and groom at their wedding? Do you think it is something from their registry, like a new set of towels or pots and pans? (<i>Pause for responses</i>)
	SAY : The Holy Spirit bestows gifts of love , righteousness , patience and endurance (<i>write on board</i>) – all important gifts for a successful marriage. The gifts of the Holy Spirit are symbolically expressed in the exchange of the vows and the wedding rings, which the priest blesses and presents individually to wear on their left hand finger.
	SAY : Selecting a wedding date is one of the first "orders of business" when planning a wedding. Just remember that when it is your turn to plan a wedding, you avoid the 40 days of Lent. No marriage can be blessed by the Armenian Church during the 40 days of Lent.
