# Faith at Home

Theme of the Sunday: Noah trusts in God.

Verse of the Sunday: "The Lord saw that the wickedness of humankind was great in the earth, and that every inclination of the thoughts of their hearts was only evil continually. And the Lord was sorry that he had made humankind on the earth, and it grieved him to his heart. So the Lord said, "I will blot out from the earth the human beings I have created—people together with animals and creeping things and birds of the air, for I am sorry that I have made them." But Noah found favor in the sight of the Lord... Noah was a righteous man, blameless in his generation; Noah walked with God." Genesis 6:5-9

Message/Moral of the day: God had a plan for Noah's life. Because he was faithful and obeyed God, Noah and his entire family trusted God and were saved. God has a plan for your life too. God has told us about his plan for us in the Bible. Listen to what he said, "I know the plans I have for you, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." If we obey and trust God's Word, his plan for our life will be successful too.

Liturgical Calendar: The Feast of the Holy Translators (Armenian: Surb T'argmanchats) is dedicated to a group of literary figures, and saints of the Armenian Apostolic Church, who founded the Armenian alphabet, translated the Bible, and started a movement of writing and translating important works into Armenian language. The Holy Translators are: Mesrop Mashtots, Sahak Partev, Movses Khorenatsi, Yeghishe, David the Invincible, Nerses IV the Gracious. The translation of the Bible was finished by the Holy Translators in 425. The first words written in Armenian were the opening line of the Book of Proverbs: Čanač'el zimastut' iwn ew zxrat, imanal zbans hančaroy. «To know wisdom and instruction; to perceive the words of understanding.» Proverbs 1:2. The first Armenian translation of the Bible is among the world's oldest, has survived and is still used in the liturgy of the Armenian Church.
