


Scope Sequence Sunday School Curriculum of the Department of Christian Education Dincese of the Armenian Church of America (Eastern)





INTRODUCTION


In 1987, the first entirely original Armenian Church curriculum for Sunday Schools, Grades Pre-K through 12 was released in its entirety. A celebration for the artists, writers, and its primary benefactors, Helen and Edward Mardigian, was held at the Diocese, attended by hundreds who were treated to a special walk-through exhibit and presentation. The curriculum was designed in eight identical units throughout each grade: The Bible, Feasts, Prayer, Sacraments, Special People of the Church, History, Badarak and Special Services, and the Life of Christ. The books were illustrated by Armenian artists and drafted by Armenian writers in close collaboration with the Department of Christian Education (then called the Department of Religious Education, DRE). It was a miraculous intersection of talent, dedication, and persistence.

But as time passed, the foundational whys and hows of faith formation along with an evolved sense of who we had become as a people and needed to be as a church prompted the Department to entirely reimagine and rewrite the curriculum starting as early as 1993 with the release of a new Pre-K. Curriculum production began in earnest in 2007 with Kindergarten. New volumes were issued each year thereafter, sometimes two in a year, until the entire curriculum was replaced. Textbooks were now based on principles that had evolved in the generation that separated them from the first edition. From the preservation/information focus of an immigrant church, the new series was founded on the personal spiritual journey of young believers in the context of the Armenian Church community of faith.

A curriculum's "Scope and Sequence" summarizes what is to be taught and the sequence in which it will be taught. Specifically, the "scope" outlines the depth and breadth of the content at each grade level and its development across grade levels. The "sequence" is the order in which the content will be taught for the best learning (building on past knowledge) within a grade and over the years. Being that attendance at Sunday School can be irregular and there is no official testing or stringent minimum requirement for graduation, the Scope and Sequence of the Sunday School curriculum is more a list of all the major concepts and topics that will be covered in each book. Over the 14 years of Sunday School ~ with the addition of classroom review, church attendance, the review course and final exam, other School activities, and family support – a basic Armenian Christian literacy can be achieved.

On the following pages, Nursery through Grade Ten will feature its table of contents and a complete list of topics covered under the following categories: Scripture, Doctrine, Prayer & Worship, the Armenian Way, and Life Application. Frankly, there is often overlap (the Lord's prayer or Hayr Mer could be listed under prayer and worship, Scripture, the Armenian Way, and Life Application) and when it became excessive it was omitted from one category since it was treated and listed in another. But whatever the organization, it is a fairly exhaustive overview of each grade. Although many schools go through Grade Eleven, that last year features a variety of choices, including mini-courses and the final review course. Grade Twelve is often a year of service, whether in the Sunday School (assistant teacher, office aide) or in the sanctuary (choir, altar server, greeter).





DOCTRINE

We believe in one God who is three persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit—the Holy Trinity.

Chrismation marks believers as Christians set apart to live a consecrated life. Jesus is God; his miracles are signs of God at work in the world.

The purpose of Jesus' teachings was to make us understand who God is.

Through our Savior Jesus Christ, we have eternal life.

The Church consists of those who believe Jesus Christ is God.

The Church began at Pentecost.

Prayer is communicating with God and developing a relationship with him.

Worship is the believing community's special time with God.

Discipleship is a commitment to follow Jesus and learn his teachings.

Christians are called to serve God and the world.

The sacraments bring God and the community into the lives of individual believers.

The sacraments of initiation (baptism, chrismation, communion) begin our life journey with God and the believing community.

During chrismation, the anointing with oil seals the individual to a life of holiness.

The sacrament of Penance, which involved confession and forgiveness, re-establishes our relationship with God.

Holy Communion unites the believer with Christ.

Through the sacrament of holy matrimony, God blesses and consecrates the marriage.

Through the sacrament of holy orders, God consecrates those who are called to serve as ordained clergy in the Church.

The Church celebrates the life of our Lord, the saints and events in salvation history through its calendar and feast days.

The Church celebrates the nativity and baptism of our Lord in the Feast of Theophany.

The resurrection of our Lord and its related feasts (Ascension and Pentecost) are the foundational events of the Church calendar.

The major feast day of the Transfiguration celebrates Jesus' glorification on Mt. Tabor.

The major feast day of the Assumption commemorates Mary's being taken up into heaven.

The major feast day of the Exaltation commemorates the re-capture of the cross and its importance as a symbol of faith in the life of the Church.

At the celebration of the Divine Liturgy, believers come together to become the Church.

The Nicene Creed is the Church's statement of faith.

The Eucharist, which is the central act of the Divine Liturgy, unites believers with Christ.

The Armenian Church belongs to the family of Oriental Orthodox Christians.

Holy Tradition informs the faith of the Church; the Bible is the foundation of Holy Tradition.

The Church believes that salvation comes through Jesus Christ.

God is Trinity (three persons): Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

God is fully present in the sacramental life of the Church and its members.

The Church is led in its worship and sacramental life by an ordained ministry.

The Christian faith has roots in Judaism.

The Nicene Creed is the statement of faith of the Armenian Church.

The life and teachings of Jesus Christ are the foundations of our faith.

God is the creator of the world and the source of all life.

Each person is free to accept or reject a relationship with God.

Jesus was fully and truly divine (God) and fully and truly human.

God becoming man is called the Incarnation.

When we are baptized, we share in the death and resurrection of Jesus.

Jesus will return in the fullness of time at the Second Coming.

The Holy Spirit dwells in the Church and in each individual believer.

The Church is the Body of Christ and believers are members of that Body.

The Holy Spirit endows believers with gifts to serve the Church.

Eternal life is a state of everlasting joy with God.

The "Word of God" refers to Scripture and to Jesus Christ, the living Word.

Through the Eucharist, we received the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

Prayer is communication with God.

DOCTRINE

Worship, and most especially the Divine Liturgy, is a way to encounter God and respond to him in praise and thanksgiving.

We live in a regular cycle of worship and religious observances, often in sync with the seasons.

The Ecumenical Councils defined the faith of the Church.

The Church was established by Christ as His Body.

When believers gather as the Body of Christ, they become a community that shares in the love of the Lord through communion, parish life and love.

During the Liturgy, the altar is a symbol of heaven.

The Gospel is revered by the faithful as the Word of God and a symbol of Jesus Christ.

The Nicene Creed is the statement of the faith of the Church.

The Eucharist is the ultimate purpose of the Divine Liturgy.

During the Liturgy, the bread and wine become the body and blood of Jesus Christ.

The Church includes both the living (the "Militant") and the dead (the "Triumphant").


