

Paper Bag Pig Puppet

Use this simple craft to reinforce a father's love for his child and that God forgives all those who ask for forgiveness.

The story of the Prodigal Son teaches us that the young son began to realize that he had made a big mistake. His only friends were pigs. He had no where to live and nothing but pig's food to eat. He began to see that he should have been happy with what he had at home. He did the wrong thing. He wasted all the money his father gave him. He missed his family and decided to go back home.



Supplies

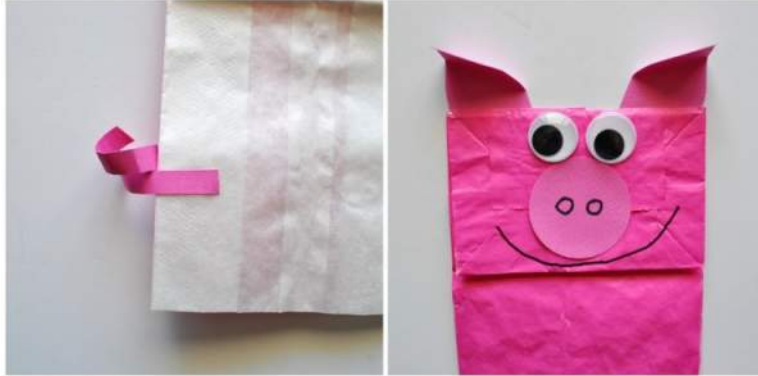
- Paper lunch bag
- Pink Construction Paper OR White Paper and Pink Crayons
- Wiggle Eyes
- Scissors
- Glue
- Black marker
- Pig Bible Verse Cards Template (*to follow*)

Instructions

1. Start by coloring the front of your paper bag with pink crayons.
2. From either your pink construction paper or White construction paper, cut out: 2 ears, a 2-inch circle nose, and a strip for your tail.



3. Glue your ears onto the back of the bag and your nose on the face of the puppet. Also, glue your googly eyes onto the face of the puppet. Bend the ears over a little to make like floppy ears.
4. Twist your pink strip of paper around your finger to make it curly. Glue it onto the back of your paper bag.



5. Draw a mouth on your puppet with your black marker.
6. Finish your puppet by gluing the Psalm 86:5 onto the front. (Template on next page.)
