B. An important command, one affecting every nation of the world, is given to the apostles.

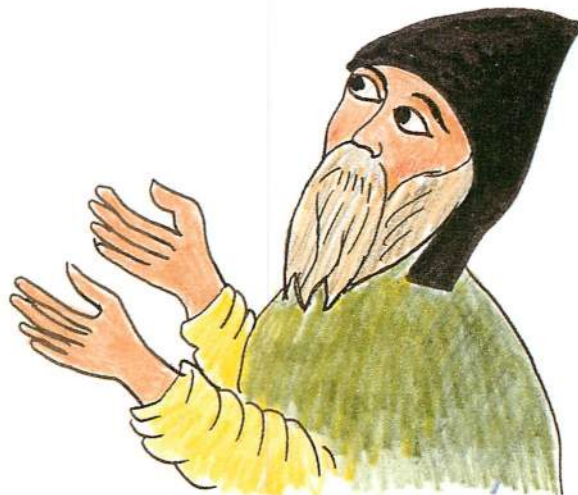
C. Christ shows the power of the Spirit by a miracle done to a man of great faith.
