# Sunday School Activity

# **SCRIPTURES**

(All from the Book of Romans)

### **MATERIALS**

- Bibles
- Poster paper or large construction paper
- Scissors
- Tape
- Colored crayons or markers
- "Scripture References" handout (to follow). Cut apart the references. If you need more, make up your own using the blank sheet.



## **PREPARATION**

 Hang a large sheet of poster paper in the front of the room along with colored crayons/markers on a chair nearby.

## **DIRECTIONS**

#### **REVIEW BEFORE PLAYING:**

(You can do this activity by putting students in small groups or individually. Give each group or individual a Bible.)

**SAY**: <u>It's easy to find things in the Bible!</u> When we know the "address," (or verse), of a scripture we're looking for, <u>it's</u> easy to find things in the Bible! Let's give it a try.

At the front of the room, hold up your Bible. Show/model the following to students using your Bible:

**SAY:** We have already learned that the Bible is divided into 2 parts: The Old Testament, which is the front section of the Bible; and the New Testament, which is the back section of Bible. We are studying the NEW Testament this year. Let's review how a Bible verse is written: (*Write "Romans 1:1"* on your poster board.)

**SAY**: Romans 1:1. The name of the book is Romans (*Circle/point to Romans*), the chapter is 1 (*Circle/point to 1*), and the verse is 1 (*Circle/point to the 1*). (Pause and guide children to find John 1:1 in Bible.) Read scripture aloud.

**SAY**: Good! I'm glad we are getting so good at finding things in the Bible.

#### **READY TO PLAY!**

**SAY**: Now you're ready to play **BIBLE SCRIPTURE RELAY!** 

- 1. Each group/person will get a Scripture "address card." (Hand out the sections of the "Scripture References" handout and allow students enough time to find the verses. For younger children, select a few "Scripture References" and together, continue practicing how to find them in the Bible.)
- 2. Look up the Scripture that's written on your card. *Hint*: All of today's scriptures can be found in the NEW TESTAMENT in the Book of ROMANS!
- 3. On the back of your card, copy what the scripture says.
- 4. When everyone has found their scripture, have each student/group take turns reading aloud and explaining in their own words what the scripture means to them. *Discuss*.
- 5. Optional for Older Students: Give each student/group a large piece of poster or construction paper and have them copy the Scripture at the top of the paper and draw a picture of what the scripture teaches.
- 6. Allow students/groups to share their scriptures/posters with class. Hang students' work in your classroom!
