

THE MYRRH BEARING WOMEN

There were eight women that are generally identified as the myrrh-bearers. Each of the four Gospels gives different aspects of the roles of these eight women at the cross and at the tomb on Easter morning, perhaps since the eight women arrived in different groups and at different times. The eight are: Mary Magdalene, Mary Theotokos [The Virgin Mary], Joanna, Salome, Mary the wife of Cleopas [or Alphaeus], Susanna, Mary of Bethany, and Martha of Bethany.

Of the eight, the first five are the more prominent and outspoken. The last three, according to tradition, were also included. Five of these women were also very wealthy. The women of means were Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Susanna and Mary and Martha of Bethany.

WORSHIPPING GOD Second Sunday of the Assumption 1 Luke 1:39-56

Did you know that you are never too young to worship God? Some people think that children don't belong in the church or that they are too young and don't understand, but we see in the Gospel today that this is not true. In the Gospel, Mary, the mother of God, visits her relative, Elizabeth. When she walks in, the baby in Elizabeth's womb, St. John the Baptist, leaps for joy in worship.

Even in the womb children can worship God because they understand and feel the presence of His holiness. This is true even today. When children are brought to the church at a very young age, they feel a sense of holiness around them. This is why it is so important for children to be in the church during the Holy Badarak and not in a classroom or outside of the church.

Children learn about God the best when they are physically worshipping Him. St. John the Baptist worshipped Christ before he even saw Him and before he was even born. In fact, one of the hymns dedicated to St. John the Baptist refers to him as, *"the one who worships from womb to womb"*.

When we come into the church to worship God we do many things. We make the sign of the cross, we bow, we like candles, we pray, we burn incense, we sing, we hug and kiss one another, we receive Holy Communion, etc. But ultimately worship cannot be confined to only in the church. Worship must be taken out of the church and lived in our everyday lives.

We must make worship part of how we live and how we interact with others, because through worshipping God every day and everywhere, others can see God as well and can jump for joy just as St. John the Baptist did.




