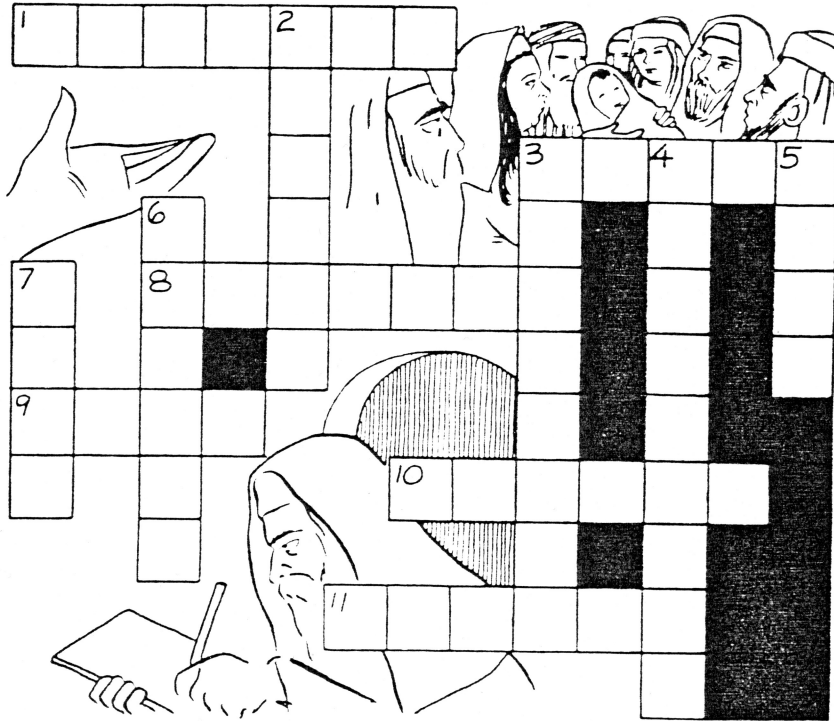


A PROPHET IS BORN

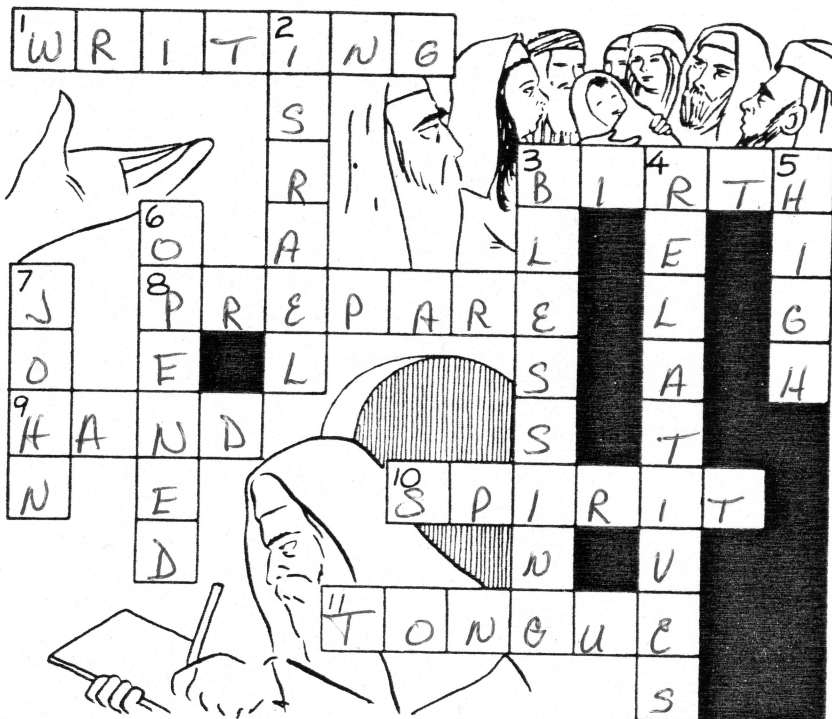
