Stained Glass Window Tissue Craft

While children are inside church, have them notice the stained glass windows. (You may even allow them to take paper and pencil inside with them to sketch what they see.) Discuss who/what the windows represent.



Materials:

- Tissue paper (you will need white *and* multi-colored)
- Construction paper (white and black)
- Wax paper
- Scissors
- Clothespins, tape, string, OR hole punch (*optional*)

Instructions:

- Cut multi-colored tissue paper in approximately 1/2 to 1-inch squares. A little goes a long way!
- Fold a sheet of BLACK construction paper in half and cut out an archway shape (you may use the Window template to trace if you wish.)
- While the archway is still folded, make a parallel cut about 1" inside the archway. This will give you your window frame.
- Cut out 1" strips from BLACK construction paper, the same width as the edge of your window frame. (These will be used to glue horizontally and vertically to create the look of a window, as seen in above picture.) Set aside.
- Open the archway and center it on a piece of wax paper.
- Place the squares of tissue paper inside the archway on the wax paper. Be careful not to go over the edge of the window frame. When the archway is filled with tissue paper, place a second piece of wax paper over the whole thing. Be careful not to make any air bubbles.
- Cut away the excess wax paper. If you leave a little bit around the edge of the archway, it will stick together better.
- Glue 1 strip of black construction paper down the center of the archway, and 2 across, as pictured above.
- You can now either tape your stained glass window in a window or use a hole punch at the top and hang it with string.
