Lesson Opening & Creating Interest:

Lesson Body:

In the Armenian Church Calendar, the third Sunday following the Glorious Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ is known as Red Sunday. The color "red" has been used throughout history to represent many things.

Q: What associations do you make when thinking of color red?

One of the symbolic meanings of this color is the blood of the martyrs who were sacrificed for Christ, His Holy Church, and their Christian faith. During the early years of Christianity, as the Church was being established, followers of Christ were subjected to severe persecutions and torments. Many chose to give up their lives and not deny their faith in the living God, Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior.

Tertullian (AD 155-220), one of our Church Fathers, said: "The blood of the martyrs is the seed of the church." This sad truth explains that the church grows and expands when martyrs die by witnessing the Truth and defending their faith.

In April of 1915 our ancestors faced persecution at the hand of the leaders of the Ottoman Empire. More than 1.5 million Armenians were killed, sent on death marches through deserts, and left to die of starvation, the elements, and disease. For more than 100 years, the children of the survivors of these horrific acts tried to teach the world about this unfortunate time in history, keeping their faith alive and strong. Then April 23, 2015 became a significant day for Armenians around the world. On this day, in a beautiful ceremony, all the martyrs of the Armenian Genocide were declared saints, for through their deaths they had received the crowns of martyrdom and become witnesses of our faith, granting us a legacy to continue, namely our faith.

In the Sunrise Service of the Armenian Church, there are many songs dedicated to the martyrs throughout the centuries, describing what examples of bravery and sacrifice they had been, trusting in the Lord, and defending our faith.

O those praised by the world and desired by the heavenly powers, you who did attain blessedness before all the sons of men; advocate to the Lord for the children of the Church.


O willing sacrifices, children in age and perfect in wisdom, who did drink the pleasing wine instead of milk; advocate to the Lord for the children of the Church.

Today, martyrdom still occurs in the lives of Christians. In fact, Christianity is the most persecuted religion in the world today. We may not experience martyrdom and struggle against wicked governments today like other Christians do throughout the world, but we do struggle against sin, which we can see manifested in many ways throughout the world. The battle against wickedness and evil, which will be eradicated in the end, is another message on Red Sunday. The Apostle Paul writes that Christ Himself endured such opposition, that we should not grow weary in our battle against wickedness. In his letter to the Hebrews, St. Paul says: "In your struggle against sin, you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood." (Hebrews 12:4).

We, as descendants of the Holy Martyrs, are to use the opportunity of Red Sunday to once again remind ourselves of the great sacrifice our Lord God made for us, as well as those who followed Him and gave up their lives for His Glory, and to continue living our lives in strong faith, goodness, and righteousness, waging war against sin, demons, and death.


