## Lesson

### Open with prayer: -

## **Lesson Body:**

This Sunday is the Sunday of the Advent. While this might be confusing, because we celebrate 50 days of Advent during the Christmas season in preparation of Jesus' birth, we also prepare for His coming during Great Lent, before Holy Week.

Advent means 'coming' or 'arrival'. According to the teachings of the Armenian Orthodox Church, Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior, came to earth for our salvation. He was born of the Virgin Mary, grew up and lived among us. This was His first advent or coming and we celebrate that on January 6th.

The Sunday of Advent is in preparation of the following Sunday, Palm Sunday, which is the celebration of the glorious entry of our Lord into Jerusalem and the beginning of Holy Week that leads us to the celebration of the miraculous Resurrection of Jesus Christ. Throughout His ministry, He promised to return and judge the living and the dead according to their deeds, granting eternal life to those who have done good and eternal torture to those who have done evil.

Jesus asked His followers to look forward to His second coming, but not to be anxious or wondering when it would be. He said that only God the Father knows when that time will be, so that the disciples do not occupy themselves with trying to figure out the day or hour. He also advised to be ready by being vigilant and continuously praying.

**Q**: When and how can we pray?

One way we pray is through singing. The angels praise God through singing and when we sing, we join them in praise. We do this during the celebration of the Divine Liturgy, when we sing the cherubic song while the Body and Blood of Christ are on the Holy Altar.

There is another time in the Divine Liturgy that we sing praises to God, yet it changes based on the holiday that the church is celebrating that day. Read the words and see what words change and what words stay the say during the season of the Resurrection and the Sunday of Advent:

#### Sung during the season of the Resurrection

Holy God, holy and mighty, holy and immortal, who did rise from the dead; have mercy on us. Soorp Asdvadz, soorp yev huzor, soorp yev anmah, vor har-yar ee me-re-lotz; vo-ghor-mya mez. (3x)

#### Sung on Sunday of Advent

Holy God, holy and mighty, holy and immortal, who came and will come again; have mercy on us. Soorp Asd-vadz, soorp yev hu-zor, soorp yev an-mah, vor yegeer yev ka-lotz yes; vo-ghor-mya mez. (3x)

What similarities and differences can you find?


