Why Do We Teach?

A Bible Study for Armenian Sunday School Teachers

There is no more important job in the Church than that of teaching. Teachers need to know this; they need to feel both the privilege and the responsability of the work they have taken on.

This Bible study is intended to help teachers take a closer look at the "why's, what's, and how's" of their work. It might be used for a teachers' meeting or as part of a retreat for teachers. Or teachers can use it individually to do some study and renewal on their own.

Time and Procedure:

Done in a group, with time for discussion, this Bible study would take 30 minutes, or more if there is a lot of discussion. Its format is to present a question, and then some Bible passage reflecting on that question, with suggested points for discussion. A group leader can use these to lead the discussion after the group, either silently or by turns aloud, has read the Bible passages.

Question One:

What did our Lord and His followers have to say about teaching?

Mt. 28: 18-20 I Tim. 4: 1-16

John 14: 25-6

Points for discussion:

- Our mandate to teach comes from God Himself, through the Holy Spirit.
- Because we teach for God, we must ourselves be steeped in His word, and teach only that.

Question Two:

How important is our teaching?

Mt. 18: 1-6 and 19:13-15

James 3:1

Points for discussion:

— The New Testament places a great responsibility on anyone who is in a position to teach, or be an example to young people and children.

Question Three:

How and what do we teach?

2 Tim. 2: 23-26 Colossians 3: 12-17 Mt. 5: 17-20

Ro. 14: 1-23 Hebrews II

I John (letter) 2: 18-25

Points for discussion:

— We teach more by example than by words or instructions to others.

- We may have to approach various people in different ways as we teach.
- The source of what we teach is God's Word, revealed through Jesus Christ.
- We have inherited the teachings of the Old Testament, which Christ fulfilled. They are part of our Christian teaching.
- Part of being a good teacher is to be able to discern the false teachings that surround us. The way to do this is to know Christ in His revelation to know and live what He taught.

A Final Note:

As teachers go through this Bible study, they should be thinking of how the words of the New Testament apply particularly to them as teachers.

They may want to use a Concordance to find and read more Biblical references to teachers and teaching.
